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Interview of the EuCARE partners

Interviewer: So, you are the Principal Investigator (PI) of the Institute of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, NOVA University of Lisbon (IHMT-UNL). Tell us a little about yourself, why are you involved with the IHMT-UNL and why is the IHMT-UNL involved in this project.

Ana Abecasis: I have a degree in Medicine and in Pharmaceutical Sciences and a PhD in Medical Sciences from the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven, Belgium. I am currently Assistant Professor of the Unit for Global Public Health at IHMT-NOVA. I am an evolutionary virologist and became involved in the EuResist network some years ago. That is how I became involved in this project. Currently I am coordinating the EuCARE project in the IHMT-UNL. We are highly involved in WP4 and I am the WP leader of WP6.













Interviewer: Besides yourself, who else participates in this project from the IHMT-UNL?

Ana Abecasis: Many of the members of my team are engaged with the project, having different tasks and working together in perfect harmony. Marta Pingarilho is the co-PI at IHMT-UNL, and participates in all the tasks of the project that we are involved here at IHMT-UNL. Victor Pimentel, a PhD researcher, is coordinating the laboratory work concerning the Schools study. Mafalda Miranda, a PostDoc of the project who was also my PhD student, is responsible for all the dissemination and communication activities of the project and also helps in the schools study. We have two scholars who were hired specifically for the project, Daniela Alves and Inês Martins Alves, who are responsible for all the logistics of the Portuguese schools study, making a perfect interaction between IHMT-UNL and the schools.

Interviewer: The final question, the EuCARE project is divided into eight workpackages (WP), right? In which ones is the IHMT-UNL involved and what has been done already?

Ana Abecasis: In IHMT-UNL we are involved with the WP4 concerning the EuCARE schools study, together with Italy and Mexico. Using the "Lolli-method" we are testing SARS-CoV-2 in schools of Amadora and Cascais municipalities, both in the Lisbon area and characterized by having a large and vulnerable migrant population. So far, we have six schools involved, most in the interventional study and others in the observational study. We are finalizing the first round of testing and have already identified many cases of SARS-CoV-2 in schools. Besides the WP4, I am the WP leader of the WP6 concerning dissemination and communication. We are responsible for the website and social media accounts of the project. We are constantly feeding the social media so that everyone can have access to the project information and raise awareness of the importance of this study.
